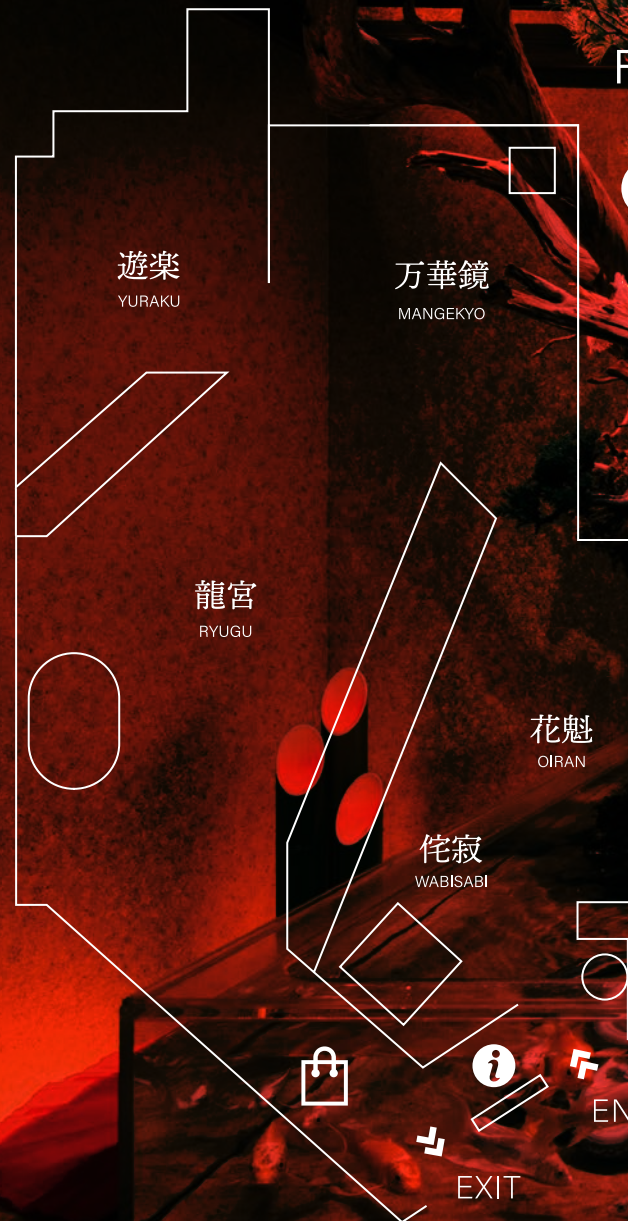

Swimming gracefully within a world created by the sound of water, the scent of fresh greenery, and powerful

driftwood, the nishikigoi (brocaded carp) are like works of art, ink paintings on a hanging scroll.

MANGEKYO

Kaleidoscope

Utilizing light reflection to produce various changing patterns, MANGEKYO kaleidoscopes are a form of Japanese illusion dating back to ancient times. Featuring mainly colorful ornamental fish, this collaborative work entices you into an overwhelmingly magical space filled with paintings by Nigamushi Tsuyoshi displaying a diversity of visual direction within a space created with Mirrorbowlers, a group of Japanese artists.

Elite Courtesans

Likening fluttering goldfish to a procession of courtesans dressed in gorgeous feather robes, this installation art exudes a neo-Japanesque mood.





龍宮 RYUGU Palace of the Dragon God

Created in the image of the mythical undersea Dragon Palace Castle in the waters off Odaiba, Tokyo, this magical space is the aquarium's main area. Aquariums, terrariums, driftwood art, and fish tank art explode the concept of aquariums with GA☆KYO-style novel and ingenious ideas. This masterpiece is the culmination of the aquarium creator's challenge over 30 years.



YURAKU 遊樂 Pleasure

The term yuraku literally means "play and enjoy". This special exhibition zone allows you to experience interactive attractions incorporating modern technologies x goldfish scoop games x fortune-telling omikuji = dejikin (electronic money) fortunes within a space designed in the image of Japan's four seasons.
